All Can, Some Should, None Must

A question that I have regularly asked of me is if the Episcopal Church has worship services like “Last Rites” and “Confession”. My answer is that those names are the colloquial names, and we in the Episcopal Church certainly do have those services. The proper name for the service of confession is *Reconciliation of a Penitent*. This short worship service has many purposes. A key purpose of the service it provides to opportunity for a child of God to make a confession about a particular sin, and receive absolution, in a nonthreatening environment. Every Sunday worshippers get a chance to make a general confession of sins. You probably have this one memorized. It begins, “Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed...” This confession covers all sins; but at times a particular sin weighs heavily on a person’s heart, and it is best to make a specific confession before God. For this reason, we Episcopalians have the service *Reconciliation of a Penitent*.

In addition to confessing specific sins that weigh the conscience, the service *Reconciliation of a Penitent* can and should be used as a regular pietistic practice. That is, Christians wishing to cleanse their souls should make a regular practice of confessing their sins before God. This is especially appropriate during penitential liturgical seasons such as Lent, but can be done at any time. The act of purposefully placing oneself before God and asking for forgiveness is liberating. There is nothing that a human being can do that is beyond the understanding and forgiveness of God. By regularly participating in *Reconciliation of a Penitent* a child of God can be repeatedly reminded of God’s goodness and mercy. I commend the practice of confession to you, and welcome you to make an appointment with me.

The easiest way to do this is through e-mail (apkradel@gmail.com). The service of confession is regularly done in the church. At times, others have requested a more private location. I know a priest who had a parishioner ask for confession to be held in the middle of an open field, and the priest granted this request. Two technical notes are that all confessions are strictly confidential, and priests and bishops who hear confessions make a practice of never mentioning the content of a confession in subsequent discussions. The service begins on page 447 of *The Book of Common Prayer*.

God’s peace be with you as we enter into the season of Lent.

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper



March 8th, 5:30—7:00 p.m.

The day before Ash Wednesday is Shrove Tuesday, sometimes called “Fat Tuesday.” Centuries ago Christians often stuffed themselves with food before beginning 40 days of fasting for Lent. In those days, many Christians used up all the food containing fat, including dairy products. Because so many foods, including pancakes, used those fat products, many churches had huge feasts. A lot of people ate until they could hold no more — the beginning of all-you-can-eat dinners. Today many congregations still keep at least a semblance of the tradition. In communities around the world, churches serve pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. But today the purpose is to have Christian fellowship, not to devour everything in sight.

Mark your calendars and plan on bringing the whole family for a yummy dinner together with your Christ Church family. Tickets will be on sale Sunday, February 27th after the 8am and 10am services and Sunday, March 6th after the 10am services in hallway outside of St. Joseph’s Hall. Cost: Adults—\$6; Children—\$3; 4 years and under, FREE!

Watch for the singing procession of church school students on March 6th as they proudly carry alleluia banners which will be "buried" in the undercroft for all of Lent. This is always a crowd favorite.

Walk Through Holy Week

This year we are planning to do our 'Walk Thru Holy Week' on **Friday April 15th from 5-8** in the evening. The walk takes a group of children through the various stages of Holy Week by having different stations for each day of Holy Week. I won't give away all the secrets of the walk, but as a teaser I will explain that on the "Good Friday" portion of the walk the children are led into an empty and darkened chapel where two adults, surrounded by votive candles, slowly and reverently retell the story of Good Friday. One by one through the story the votives are extinguished until all light is eliminated from the chapel. I can tell you that it is just as dramatic as it sounds. The children were very impressed with the walk last year, and so were the adults. I encourage you to bring your children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, godchildren, and anyone you see walking on the street. This is a fabulous experience for everyone.

In addition to our grand events, the regular Sunday after mass classes will continue. For Lent, the godly play classrooms will engage in an exploration of the faces of Easter. This program encourages a study of the life of Jesus with special attention to his ministry as a preparation for his death and resurrection. The 2-3 class will continue with its preparation for Easter by using the lectionary based curriculum, Living the Good News. We are all looking forward to an exciting spring.

The Spiritual Life Team is offering several events during Lent. We hope you will be able to participate.

On Saturday, **March 12**, Mother Melissa Wilcox will lead a retreat titled *Lent: A Time of Blessing and Temptation*. The retreat will take place at Christ Church from 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. Light refreshments will be available starting at 8:45 a.m. Mother Melissa will deliver three reflections, with time for quiet and meditation. Participants are invited to bring a journal, a Bible, and comfortable clothes. Mother Melissa plans to have a few stations around the nave where people can work quietly on responding to the meditations through a variety of activities (e.g., art, collage, making prayer beads). The retreat will conclude with Holy Eucharist. The cost for the retreat is \$10 per person.

On Thursday, **March 17**, at 7:30 p.m., the Spiritual Life Team will hold a Taizé service in the church sanctuary. The service will be led by Father Randy and accompanied by hammer dulcimer, flute, and recorder. Come join us for a time of silence and spiritual refreshment.

On Sunday, **April 3**, our friends and neighbors at Congregation Ohev Shalom, in Wallingford, will once again come to Christ Church for a model Seder, which is an instruction and meal explaining and celebrating the Passover of the Hebrews. Rabbi Jeremy Gerber will again lead the Seder, which will begin at 2:00 p.m. and last for approximately three hours. Adults and children are welcome to this joyous celebration of our Jewish roots. We will be posting sign-up sheets for attendance and for food and beverage contributions. The Spiritual Life Team will also be providing some ideas and recipes for vegetarian dishes. NOTE: This will be the last opportunity for family or individual photos before the 2011 Directory is published. Do not miss out on your chance to be "captured in print"!

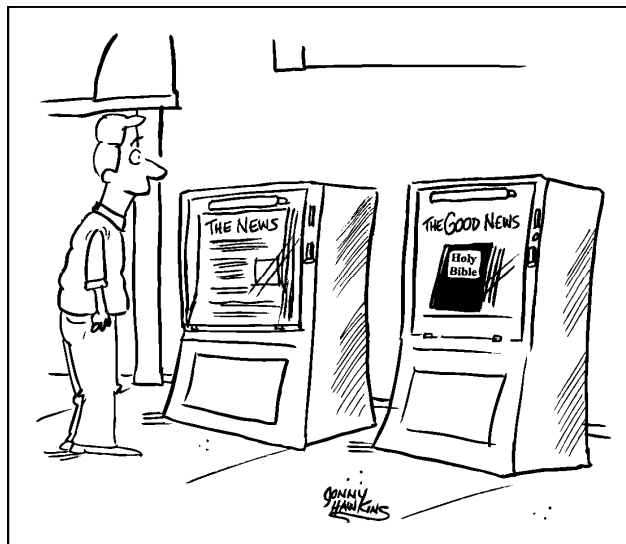
Have you noticed the changes in the Christ Church website? Laura Hanson has added a new photo album with 20 new photos taken by Andy Kirk of the Christmas season.

HOT CROSS BUNS

Make this traditional Easter recipe to remember how Christ gave his life for you.

What you need:

- 1 can (12 oz.) evaporated milk
- 1 stick (½ cup) butter, melted
- ½ cup sugar
- Pinch of salt
- 1½ Tablespoons yeast
- 1 egg, beaten
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg
- 5 cups flour
- Icing
- An adult to help

What you do:




1. In large bowl, combine the first eight ingredients.
2. Stir in flour, one cup at a time, to form soft dough. Knead on a floured surface until smooth and elastic (about five minutes).
3. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease top. Cover and let rise until doubled (about one hour).
4. Knead out air bubbles. Form six two-inch balls.
5. Place two inches apart on a greased cookie sheet. Cover and let rise until doubled (about 30 minutes).
6. Bake at 375 degrees until golden (13 to 15 minutes). Cool on wire racks.
7. Add icing in a cross shape. Enjoy!






















