Our Society's Battling Parenting Manuals

This article is about how all members of Christ Church have a responsibility for the children in the parish.

On Friday 19 March 2011 Manhattan resident Nicole Imprescia filed a lawsuit against her \$19,000 a year preschool claiming that the school had failed to adequately prepare her four-year-daughter to take an intelligence test that would qualify her for the hypercompetitive private schools in their neighborhood. The mother's complaint was that the preschool was just, "one big play room." Nicole Imprescia's anxiety over her four year old daughter's ability to excel on an intelligence test immediately entered the long-standing debate about the best way to raise one's children.

Recently those who read the *New York Times*, *The Atlantic*, or even *Time* or *Newsweek* magazines have been inundated with a public debate circling around the best parenting methods. First, a Chinese-American Law professor at Yale declared that Westerners are indulgent of their children and what children really need is to be directed with exacting discipline.¹ She then asserts that children should have it forcefully impressed upon them that they are expected to produce high levels of academic and extracurricular achievement.² Then, an economist at George Mason University replies that he has good data that healthy, high achieving parents will have healthy high achieving children, regardless of parenting styles. I have to admit a preference for the findings of the economist, if for no other reason than the economist presents information to back up his statements while the law professor's only weapons were her assertions. But this entire public debate leads us to a greater question: What does our faith in Jesus tell us about the proper way to parent?

A quick search through Amazon.com reveals a large variety of book offering advice on Christian parenting. Maybe some of these books are worth a read, but much more is to be gained by raising children as part of the common life of a parish community. Authors tend to sell books by giving answers to questions. The dilemma is that many parenting questions have no answers. For instance, one could ask, "What does the Bible say about parenting?" Well if you read the book of Genesis you learn that Jacob made a point of visibly favoring one of his children (first Joseph, then Benjamin) over all the others. If you read the New Testament you learn that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs (Matthew 19:14)." Matthew tells us that Jesus loves all the little children of the world, but we do not know how Jesus would parent because Jesus was never a parent.

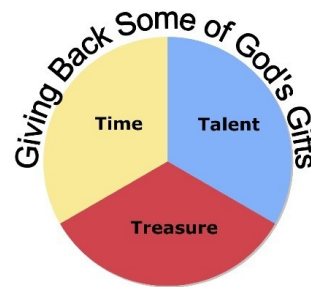

Therefore, I repeat myself. How should a Christian be a parent? Be sure to raise your child in a faith community. By participating in the life of the church, you provide your child with a vision of how Jesus taught people to live, and you teach your child about God's promises for the future.

My last point is my most important. To those who are not in the midst of parenting in your own household, your ministry is the same. Your goal is to provide the children of Christ Church with a vision of how Jesus taught people to live. Your goal is to teach the children of Christ Church about God's promises for the future.

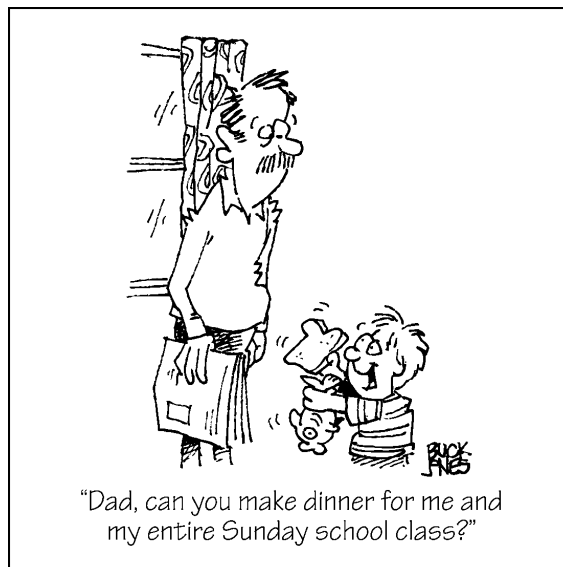

Education for Ministry Study of Bible and Church History

The Education For Ministry (EFM) program is an in-depth study of Old Testament, New Testament, Church History, and recent theologians. The program is an extension course from the University of the South, for lay people of the Church. EFM meets once a week, from September-May, in a group of 10 people who become a supportive learning community together. There are several openings for this September in a group in our area. On Thursday, **May 19, at 7:30 p.m.**, we'll hold a **Taizé service** in the church sanctuary. The service will be led by Fr. Randy Williamson and includes accompaniment by hammered dulcimer, mountain dulcimer, flute, and recorder. Note: If you play a wind or string instrument, consider joining us. The music is very easy. On Saturday, **June 11, at 7:00 p.m.**, we'll have **Film Night in St. Mary's Hall**. We plan to show the documentary *Niger '66: A Peace Corps Diary*. In the summer of 1966 a group of 65 idealistic Peace Corps volunteers headed for Africa and landed in the dusty, heat-scorched desert of Niger. They stayed for two years working in agriculture, digging wells and starting health clinics for women and their babies. In 2008 five of them returned to Niger to revisit the country, see their old friends and witness how their work has improved the lives of the people there. The documentary also explores the culture shock of re-entry into the U.S. in the turmoil of 1968 and how their experience in Africa influenced their future work.

During the month of June we'll develop and distribute a survey to gauge interest in potential men's groups (e.g., Dad's group, Saturday morning Bible study).

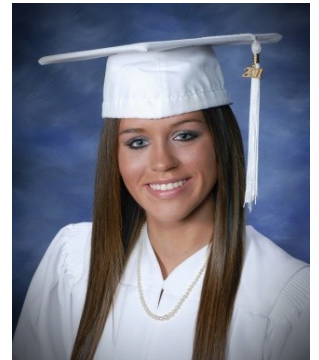
Chelsea Niara Brown




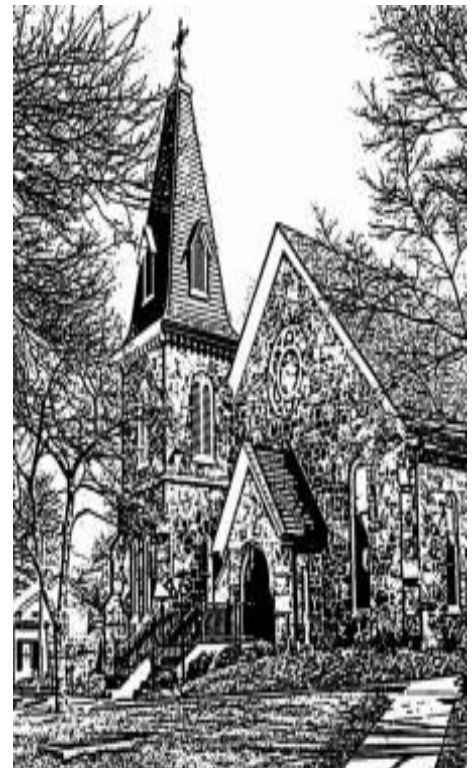
