Just what is the Book of Common Prayer?

This may seem like a nonsensical question to you cradle Episcopalians. Or - maybe – you have longed to ask this question but were too afraid to mouth the words. The *Book of Common Prayer* is our guide for worship of God, and it this worship of God that unites to other Anglicans in the United States and across the globe.

The red book that you see in our pews is our American version of the original *Book of Common Prayer*, which was compiled and edited by Archbishop of Canterbury Thomas Cramner in 1549. I have a facsimile of the 1549 prayer book in my office and am happy to show it to you. If you want to learn more about Thomas Cramner, ask Jack McCullough, as he has read an extensive biography of Cramner. Cramner was a skilled priest, writer and editor. Cramner longed to have worship of God in England occur in the language of the people, rather than in Latin. His greatest work was crafting our first prayerbook. Now more than 70 million Anglicans across the globe use a prayer book derived from Cramner’s 1549 version. The 1549 version has provided us with a host of very familiar turns-of-phrase. For example, the wedding service begins, “Dearly beloved friends, we are gathered together today in the sight of God...”

The *Book of Common Prayer* 1979 is a collection of ancient and modern prayers, to be used for common worship in the Episcopal Church USA. It includes the LORD’s Supper, Baptism, Holy Matrimony, Burial of the Dead, and prayers that can be used throughout the day known as the Daily Office. Just as Cramner intended, the liturgy is common, that is, it is for everyone. Our worship requires that all present participate and thereby it empowers all of God’s people to relate to God through communal worship.

You may ask of the source of the prayers. Two-thirds of the prayer book comes directly from the Old and New Testaments. Some prayers, such as Eucharist Prayer D which is attributed to St. Basil the Great, are very old. Some prayers, such as Eucharistic Prayer A, are very new. I actually know the son of H. Boone Porter who wrote Eucharistic Prayer A. Fr. Randy is well acquainted with the man who crafted the prayer over the water for our current baptismal service.

If you know anything about the current prayer book, it is vital to know that the central service is Holy Eucharist. The service presents Jesus’ Last Supper that he had with his disciples before he was trapped by religious authorities. Reliving Jesus’ Last Supper is central to our common life as a church. When we worship on Sunday at Christ Church, Media, please know that we are worshipping God and communing with Christians across the globe.

They are also eager for our attention. As Screwtape says to Wormwood, "we can use this to our advantage..." Talk to the next child you see and ask them about their favorite bible story. Ask them to name the books of the bible. Ask them to help you set up for coffee hour, or to tidy the pews after Mass. Be a teacher – be a Christian witness to a child and earn your apple.

Christ Church Preschool Dedicated to the Joy of Learning

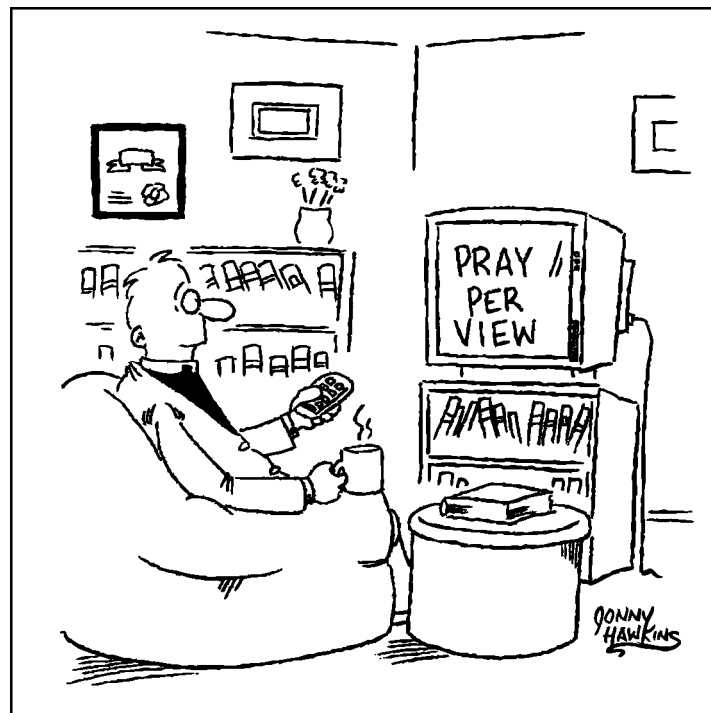
Welcome back...Christ Church Preschool begins on **Tuesday, September 6th!**

8. Put cookies into bags and tie with a ribbon. Then give away these edible smiles!

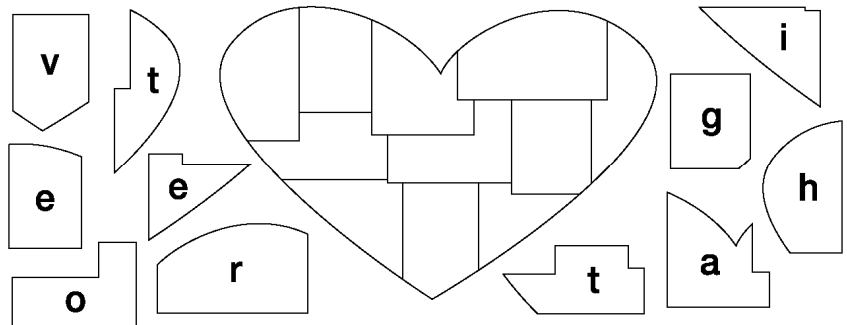

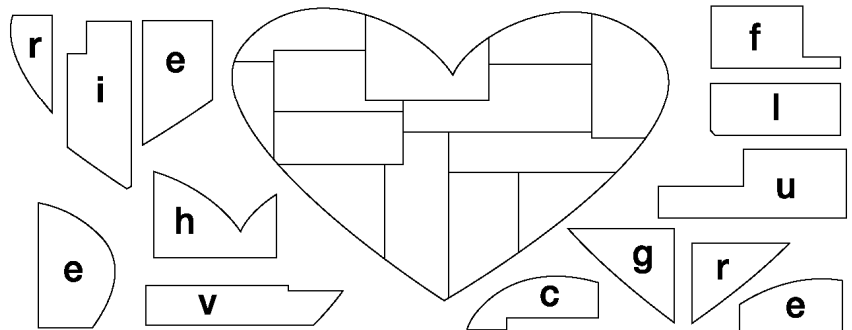
We can give in a variety of ways, including our money, possessions and time. But God says there's only one attitude to have when we give.
